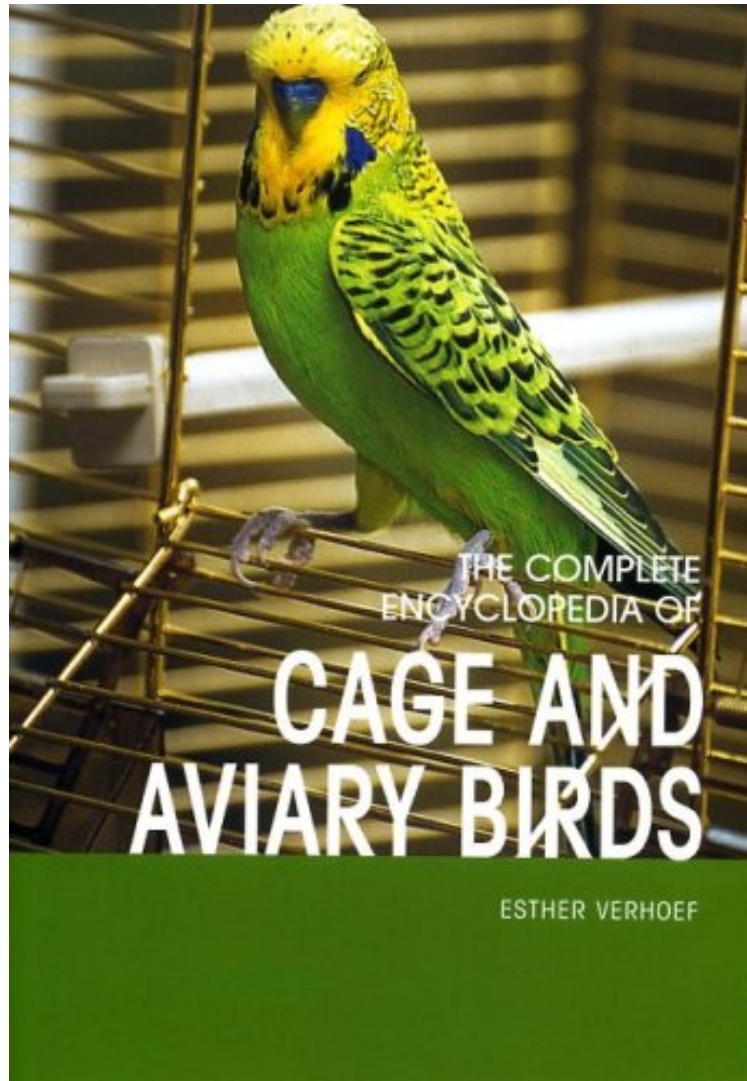

I actually have the 302-page 2nd edition reprint published in 2004. This is an outstanding, color-photographs on every page, or nearly so. The eight page index, alone, has 26 color pics. I have three different encyclopedias of cage birds and I love each of them. Probably any one of the three would be sufficient, but this book from the Netherlands written by Esther J. J. Verhoef-Verhallen is as good as they come - providing details as to habitat, distribution, and social characteristics, as well as:*

Suitable housing* Ambient temperature* Feed* Activities* Breeding Generally, there are about two pages of information (including a color photo) for each bird variety discussed. Complete Encyclopedia of Cage Aviary Birds has a short (1 page) Table of Contents. There are 14 topics, with 13 sections segregated according the classifications, i.e., quails, doves, waxbills, parrots and the like (psittacidae), etc. Preceding those 13 sections is chapter 1, Accommodations; Food and Nutrition; Care; Breeding; Mutations. This chapter is 53 pages of essential information, studded with 174 color pics, 55 of which are of seeds or habitat. Bearing in mind this is a 300-page book, and that there were 174 pics in the first 60 pages, including front matter, I would estimate there to be at least 1,000 color photographs in this gem. I wish only that this book were also available as an eBook and that I could rate it at 10 Stars. I do wonder, however, why it is that so many outstanding books and magazines are published either in Europe or in Australia? Surely there is sufficient interest and market to publish such material within the USA and Canada? 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
