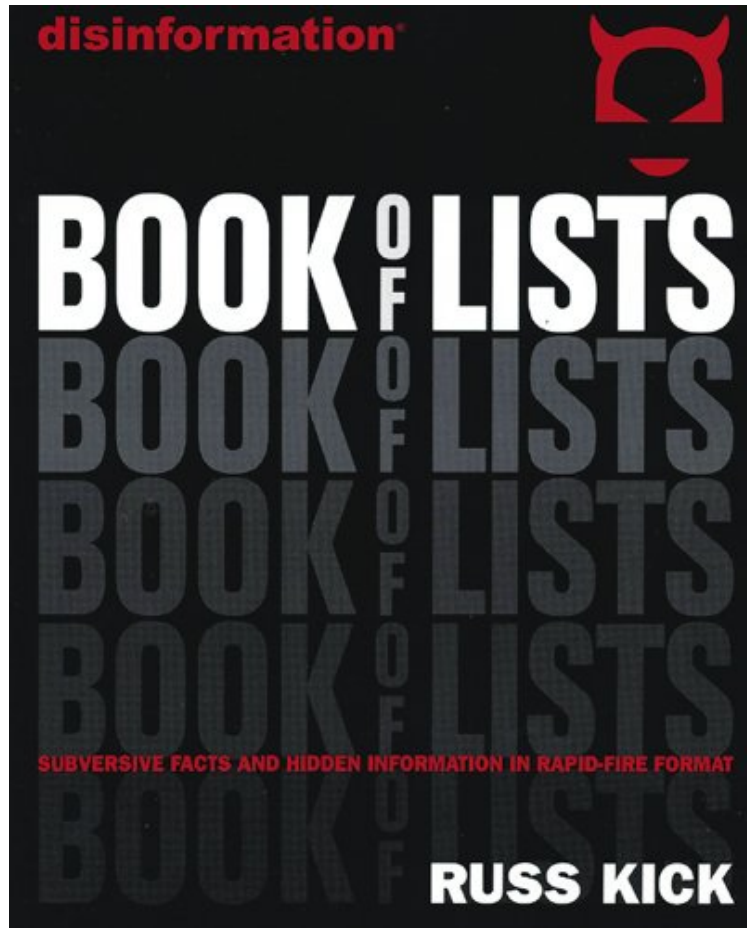

The absolute best list, however, is "12 Reviews of Senator Bill Frist's Family History," which had me ROTFLAMO'ing. (Look it up, the book title is "Good People Beget Good People.") A gamut of topics are covered in this book of lists: politics, religion, movies music, The CIA FBI, crime punishment, war peace, among others. No matter your interests, you're guaranteed to find it entertaining.

Can you name five military leaders who were transgendered?Twelve cases of involuntary human experimentation by the U.S. government?How about the four porn novels written by famous authors, 11 books left out of the Bible and over 50 side effects of NutraSweet that have been reported to the FDA?In 1977, David Wallechinsky, Irving Wallace and Amy Wallace published The Book of Lists, causing an immediate sensation.
