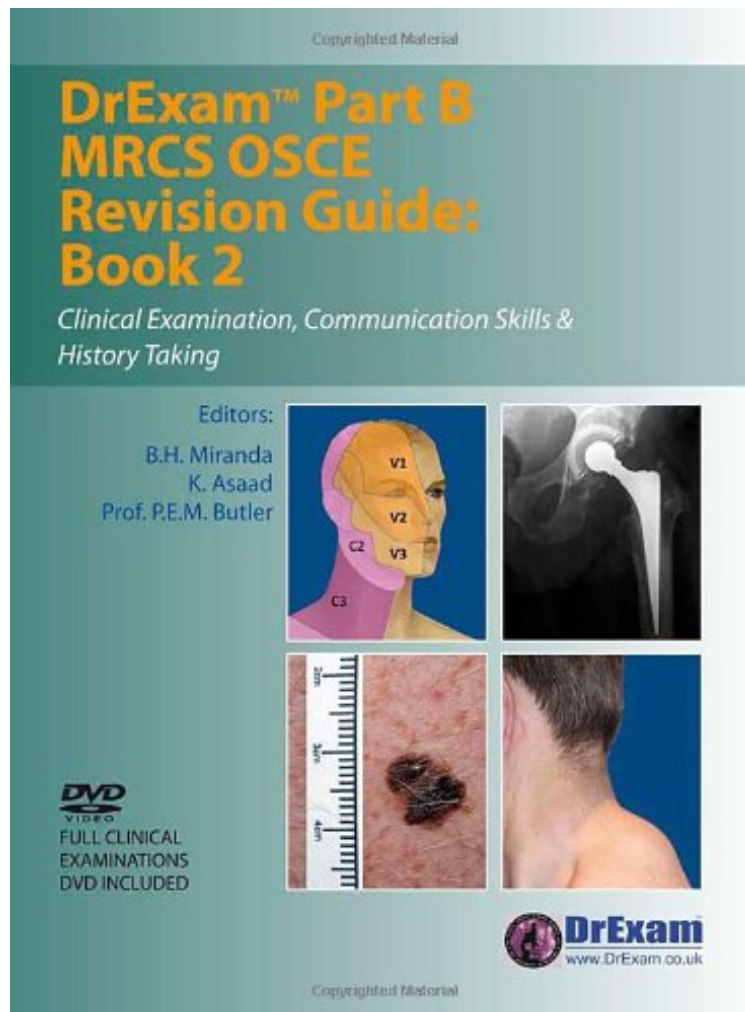

(clinical examinations) and DVD 2 are worth the price of admission though - the exam techniques provided are didactic and robust in comparison to both OSCEs in Surgery book and Parchment-Smith's MRCS book. The DVD is excellent and provides a bullet-proof exam technique to get through - and in a way that I think is much clearer and less verbose than both the mentioned books above. But - it needs some vignettted cases - which is the undoubted strength of the parchment-smith book and a list of likely cases like the OSCEs in surgery book. The technique system though is the best of the three.
