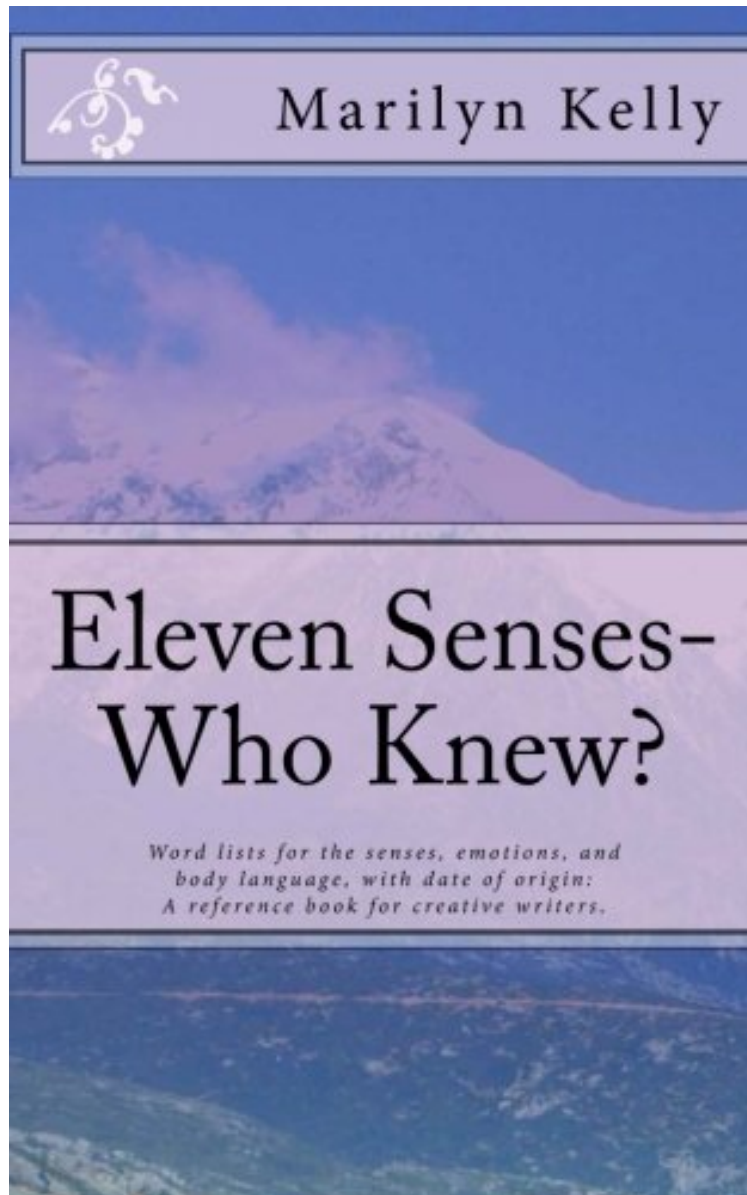

Let me be clear, this review is for the KINDLE version. The content is good. I mean, it has a lot of lists of words that are beneficial to a writer looking for help finding the perfect word to describe a character or an emotion. I just wish the Table of Contents included links in the Kindle version. In order to find what you're looking for you have to go through every page to get to the eleven different senses the author talks about. They aren't listed in the Table of Contents with links, so you can just jump to the section on Sight or the section on hearing. You have to scroll thru all the pages, which is tedious. Had I know that, I would have bought a hard copy of it instead of the Kindle version. It could be a great reference tool, but I doubt that I'll use it very often simply because when I'm looking for a word, I don't want to page through every page of the book to find what I'm looking for. Not even the GO TO function works, since the Table of Contents lists page, but the GO TO asks for location. I don't know what location page 96 is at, so I don't know what to enter.
