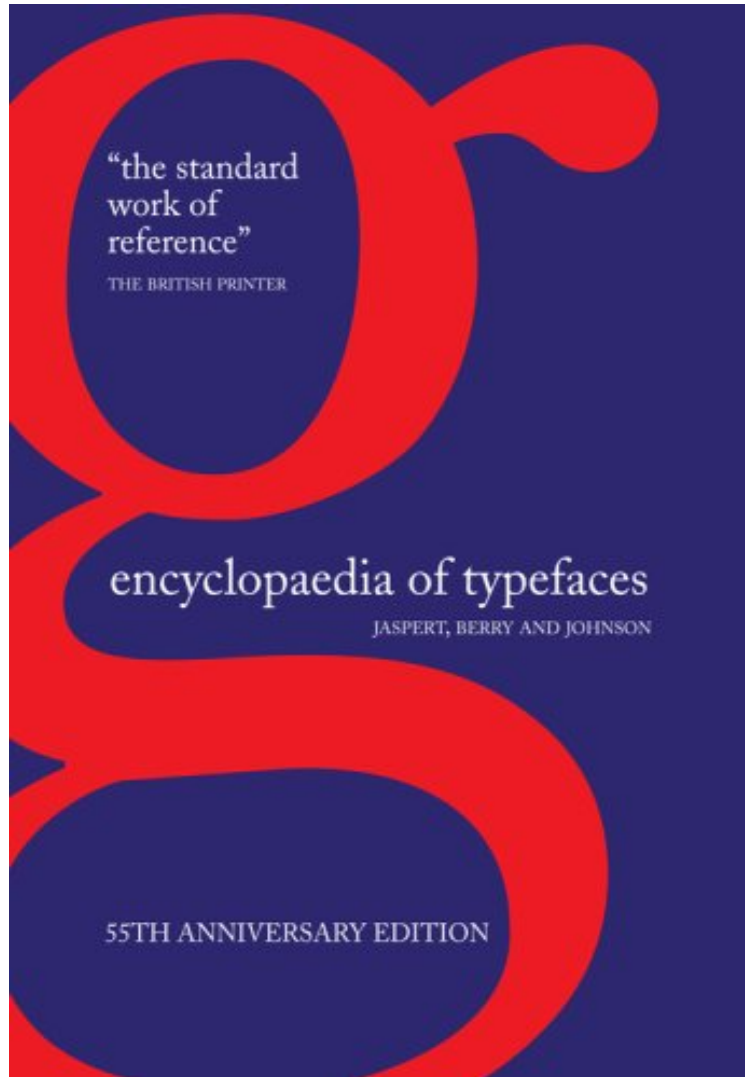


Encyclopaedia of Typefaces

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are often shown as complete alphabets and the original foundry and date as well as information about the designer are included. Indexes include an alphabetical as well as a listing by designer. I have an early version of this from the 1950s and it was nearly worn out. A few years ago, I purchased this edition (not the budget version that was unavailable at the time). I recommend this book to anyone interested in the background and history of type and is a good source for learning where some of the present day digital fonts originated.

For over 50 years, Encyclopaedia of Typefaces has been the dominant typeface guide and now the internationally celebrated work is published in a new 55th Anniversary edition.

About the Author W. Pincus Jaspert, W. Turner Berry and A.F. Johnson came together to produce the first edition of Encyclopaedia of Type Faces, which was published in 1953. After the death of Berry and Johnson, Jaspert took over revision and editing. An international expert on print and publishing, he lives in London.
