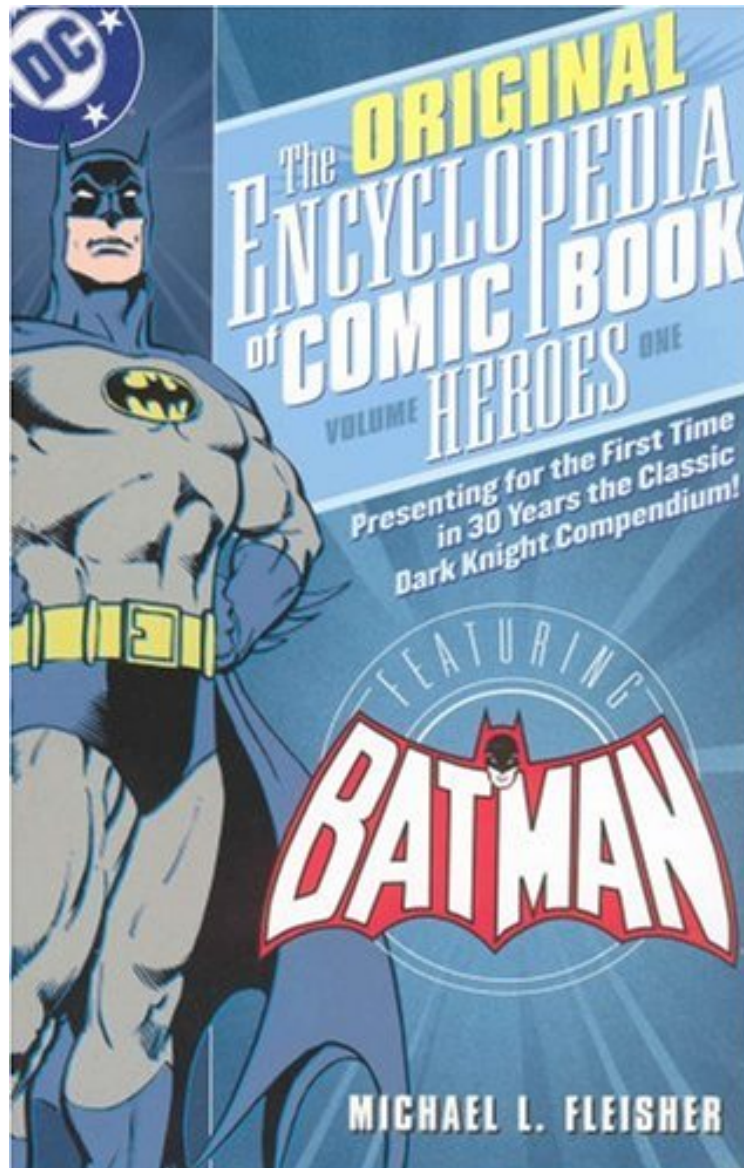

This book is for all of us bat-fans who remember it from the 70's and have had a hell of a time trying to find it again since it has been out of print for decades. One thing to remember is that when this book was published in 1976 it was already 10 years out of date! The bat-history contained within stops at 1965 and that means no Man-Bat, no Ra's Al Ghul or anything else that has happened since 1966 onward. The information that is included is VERY complete. There is just about EVERYTHING from Batman's golden age and part of the silver age with an alphabetical listing of all things Batman. Ever wonder what was in Batman and Robin's utility belts? Wonder no more, you can find out here (with pictures no less). I even wrote the publisher and was told that only the first three would be issued, and those are also now back in print.
